

I found at times the viewpoints on events to be fairly subjective, connecting together a cause and effect, or an action and subsequent reaction in a very black and white fashion. I realize that the burden of covering a significant event or happening within a short page or two can lead to some generalizations or loss of nuance, so it can be excused. Maybe that tendency is my beef with History books in general after all, and not a shortcoming of this book.
